





Halifax filmmaker Jacob Medjuck's long-awaited summer camp comedy has arrived with an industrial-strength sense of humour, a touch of melancholy and a killer 80s soundtrack. With marvelous narration by Hollywood heavyweight John Cusack, Summerhood chronicles a pivotal summer in the life of a 10-year-old nicknamed Fetus, who falls head over heels for the camp's local preteen beauty. Fetus and his posse have earned their title as the summer resort's tricksters and outcasts, as they dedicate their time and energy to sinking paddleboats and meddling with the camp public address system. Blisteringly funny and beautifully written, Summerhood joins Meatballs and Bless the Beasts and the Children in the elite cadre of the best summer camp movies of all time.
